## TJNA announces the exit of its Executive Director

**Nairobi, 8<sup>th</sup> December 2022**: – The Tax Justice Network Africa (TJNA) is announcing that its founding Executive Director, Alvin Mosioma, will be transitioning from the organization effective 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2023. Mr. Mosioma is leaving TJNA after 15 years at the helm, having cofounded the organization in 2007.

"Steering the Network from its inception and seeing it grow to become the leading voice on matters of Tax Justice in Africa has been the most gratifying professional and personal endeavor. Together we have built a strong foundation and infrastructure that will allow TJNA to flourish and become an ever-more sustainable, responsive pan-African organization, central to the fiscal justice movement in Africa and across the globe," Mr. Mosioma said.

Under Mr. Mosioma's leadership, TJNA's continental footprint has grown from an initial membership of six organizations to 42 members spread across 27 countries. The organization has also established strategic partnerships and collaboration with leading institutions and Networks, including the Africa Tax Administration Forum (ATAF), African Union, United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA), and the Global Alliance for Tax Justice, among others.

"Even as I exit, this is not a goodbye. I remain committed to our common goal of working towards a continent where all our African citizens can live a dignified life devoid of poverty in all its manifestations," Mr. Mosioma added.

TJNA's Executive Council has begun the recruitment process for Mr. Mosioma's replacement and has appointed Ms. Chenai Mukumba, the current Policy, Research, and Advocacy Manager, as the interim Executive Director. She takes over this role effective 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2023 until a substantive Executive Director is appointed.
